1. Old Business

The previous Minutes were accepted as written.

2. Report of Officers

**Treasurer** - Tom stated that the Treasurer will provide a written report, to be included with the meeting minutes.

3. Report of Committee Chairs

**Registrar** - Joann stated that there are approximately 1,000 PVMS members. She also mentioned that an application was submitted to form a USMS-recognized team at Marymount, but there weren't at least four initial individual USMS applications, so the team's application was denied (per the PVMSC by-laws).

**Top 10** - Dave reported that the Short Course Yards Top Ten times have been tabulated for the individual events. After he tabulates the Top Ten times for the relays, he will publish the results (by the July 15 deadline).

**Sanctions** - Lynn reported the following meet sanction results:

Burke Masters - Lane ropes should have a different color marker 15 feet out, at both ends of the rope.

Ancient Mariners - Final results weren't printed in the standard format.

Reston Masters - Lane ropes should have a different color marker 15 feet out, at both ends of the rope. Also, the referee didn't notify swimmers when they were disqualified.

Reston Lake Swim - Minor problems occurred with the start of the race and the PA system.

Terrapin 1500 - No problems.

New sanction packets were sent to meet directors. The current sanction policy penalizes teams monetarily for infractions. We should abide by that policy (without complaint), or submit a suggested policy change for vote.

It's very important for meet directors to consider the impact of allowing people to register for USMS on the day of the race. To minimize confusion and ensure that no one swims

unregistered, meet directors may want to require that USMS registration be completed prior to race day. Also, they should be sure that all swimmers sign their release.

The evaluators for upcoming meets are as follows:

- July - DCRP Long Course - Joann Leilich
- Aug. - \*DC Masters - Tom Denes  
\* (This meet isn't being held at the traditional Oak Marr location. Joann will send notices to the team reps reminding them of the location change.)
- Oct. - DCAC Columbus Day Classic - to be determined

**Officials** - Pat distributed an updated list of approved officials (attached).

**Awards** - Debbie distributed the suggested awards criteria, and Joann will send Debbie the former criteria. It was agreed that there will be three sets of awards, corresponding to the long-course meters, short-course meters, and short-course yards seasons. The summer newsletter will contain the criteria, so that teams can nominate people. (A copy of the updated awards criteria is attached, as well as a letter from Debbie to the team reps explaining about the awards process.)

#### 4. New Business

**USMS Convention Delegates** - Lynn distributed a detailed write-up summarizing the work of the Ad Hoc PVMSC Convention Committee (which consisted of herself, Joann Leilich, and Nancy Surdoval). It discussed why we should attend the USMS National Convention, the PVMSC resolution concerning USMS Convention delegates (and some suggested changes), and some legislation considerations. (These are provided as attachments to the minutes.)

It was agreed that in order to make an informed decision about how much money to provide for delegates' expenses to the USMS National Convention, we need to know our current financial situation. Tom Denes, as PVMSC Chair, and Lynn Hazlewood, as Convention Committee Chair, will examine the financial situation, and make a decision. We need to consider that most of the upcoming National Conventions are also "long-distance", so the expense decision should be applicable to those as well.

We approved the legislative change proposal for submission at the Convention. Tom will submit it to USMS by the July 10 deadline. In addition, PVMSC delegates will try to vote as a block, as much as possible, at the Convention.

**PVMSC Annual Meeting** - The PVMSC Annual Meeting will be held after the Turkey Classic Meet on Sunday Nov. 21. Elections for officers will be held at this time. There will not be any PVMSC meetings before then.

Across the top:

- Club = self explanatory (NOTE: in column, UN = unattached; these are most of our senior officials who no longer have kids actively swimming)
- O = (club) Officials Chairman
- REF = Referee (NOTE: In PVS, whether the other columns indicate it or not, a referee must be certified in all lesser judgmental positions as well as Clerk of Course and Chief Timer)
- STR = Starter
- S\_T = Stroke & Turn Judge
- CLK = Clerk of Course
- HJ = Head Judge (term used erroneously and will be changed this year to reflect the true qualification, namely "TJ" for "Timing Judge")
- ET = Electronic Timer (console operator)
- CMP = Computer (operator for "Swim Master" and other meet programs)
- OTH = Other (Timer, etc.)
- CERT = Certified (date of last certification)
- NO = Number (PVS certification number)
- REDO = Redone (last time PVS certification was updated)
- EXPR = Expires (date when current certification will expire)
- US = USS (year of latest USS membership)
- CLN = Clinic (date of last clinic attended)
- POS = Position (for which attended the clinic; REF picks up everything)
- SPEC = Special qualifications (e.g., NATL = nationally certified)

**AD HOC PVMSC CONVENTION COMMITTEE  
REPORT TO PVMSC BOARD—JUNE 27, 1993**

The committee was formed by PVMSC Chairman Tom Denes to determine 1) why should PVMSC send delegates to the USMS convention, 2) how many delegates should we send, 3) who are the delegates that will be sent and 4) where does PVMSC stand on the issues to be discussed at convention.

The committee has made the following determinations:

- 1) PVMSC should send all three voting delegates to the USMS convention (see attachment *Why Attend USMS National Convention?*).
- 2) PVMSC should choose their voting delegates according to the *PVMSC Resolution Concerning USMS Convention Delegates* (see attached resolution—including suggested changes—which was passed 11/19/89). Board members who have expressed an interest in attending the convention as voting delegates are Lynn Hazlewood, Debbie Morrin and Pat Diehl. Tom Denes, David Smith, Jennifer Gittins and Nancye Schap have declined. Joann Leilich (Chairman, National Registration Committee) and Dave Diehl (Member, Rules Committee) are at-large delegates. The rest of the Board has not stated their preferences.
- 3) PVMSC should fund the three voting delegates plus the two at-large delegates according to the process outlined in the *PVMSC Resolution Concerning USMS Convention Delegates*.
- 4) At the June 27 Board meeting, PVMSC should discuss the legislation issues presented in the *Legislation Considerations* attachment.

## WHY ATTEND USMS NATIONAL CONVENTION?

Each year PVMSC is entitled to send three voting delegates to the USMS National Convention (this is determined by the number of registered swimmers we have). In addition, we normally have one or more delegates who can go as voting delegates in other capacities (this year there are two). The question has been asked why should PVMSC fund a full complement of delegates to the convention? The answer falls into three parts: 1) What benefits will PVMSC derive from having delegates at convention?; 2) What is the obligation of PVMSC to USMS?; and 3) Do we need all potential delegates present to gain the benefits and fulfill our obligations?

### Benefits to PVMSC

Having people at the National Convention benefits PVMSC in the following ways:

- 1) PVMSC gains first-hand knowledge of important matters discussed at the convention. Brief overviews in *Swim* magazine and documentation distributed by the National Office do not adequately convey all the information about decisions made at convention.
- 2) Having delegates at convention gives PVMSC input in decisions that directly affect our organization (for example, how much we charge to register with PVMSC). If we have no people there, we have no voice.
- 3) PVMSC personnel benefit from the growth of their knowledge about USMS. This helps them to be better ambassadors for USMS in the community as well as increasing their value as working members of PVMSC. This small "perk" each year keeps the local volunteers involved.

### Obligation to USMS

PVMSC not only has the right to send delegates to the USMS National Convention, but it has an obligation to send them. USMS is a volunteer organization with only a few paid workers. USMS depends on volunteers to make the organization go. PVMSC is a part of USMS and has an obligation to participate in the convention each year which is the time most of the business of USMS is conducted. If all the LMSCs took the attitude that they don't have to send all their delegates because it is of no benefit to them, then the organization would fail for lack of workers.

### How Many Delegates to Send

PVMSC should send all the voting delegates to the convention that it is allowed for the following reasons:

- 1) In order to cover all the committee meetings adequately, we need as many people as we can send.
- 2) The more PVMSC people who go to convention, the more intimate knowledge we have in the local committee. In addition, people are inspired to do more when they feel more a part of the organization.
- 3) We should have all the votes we are entitled to when decisions are made in the House of Delegates. Sometimes the outcome of contentious issues are determined by very few votes.
- 4) We cannot fulfill our obligations to USMS by sending a minimum number of delegates. USMS needs all the people they can get to do the large number of jobs required to run an organization of this size.
- 5) Most members of USMS and Potomac Valley would rather pay than volunteer their time. Each member of Potomac Valley pays \$1.50-\$2.00 per year to send "the workers" to convention. A very small amount!

## PVMSC RESOLUTION CONCERNING USMS CONVENTION DELEGATES

Enacted at the PVMSC Board Meeting of 11/19/89 as modified 6/27/93

It is resolved that PVMSC delegates to the USMS National Convention will be selected and funded based on the benefit to be gained by PVMSC from their going to convention.

PVMSC **voting delegates** to the USMS National Convention will be chosen from **active** committee members. An active committee member is one who during the preceding year has 1) attended a majority of PVMSC meetings and 2) has made a significant contribution to the functioning of PVMSC either in an official or unofficial position. Voting delegates will be chosen according to the following order of precedence:

- 1) PVMSC Registrar: The person who will be registrar starting in January of the following year.
- 2) PVMSC Chairman: The person who will be chairman starting in January of the following year.
- 3) The remaining PVMSC officers and committee chairmen who will be in office starting in January of the following year. Selection should be rotated among these committee members on an equitable basis from year to year every two years.
- 4) Other PVMSC Board members.
- 5) Swimmers registered in Potomac Valley who are active in the administration of their teams with preference given to Meet Directors.

The above order of precedence may be modified as follows:

- 1) A person in line for a delegate position who can go to convention as a voting delegate in another capacity (for example as a National Committee Chairman, National Officer, Zone Chairman or Delegate at Large) is not eligible for one of PVMSC's voting delegate slots. In this case, that person's slot will be allocated to the next person in order.
- 2) PVMSC may wish to reward a committee member who has done extraordinary work for PVMSC during the year or who is a member of a national committee. In this case, that person could be given a delegate slot ahead of members who may have come higher in order of precedence.

Each year a sum of money will be set aside in the budget for convention expenses. Funding is available only to **active** Committee members or voting delegates. The money shall be distributed in the following order until the funds are exhausted:

- 1) Convention registration fees, travel and room expenses but not board will be paid for PVMSC voting delegates. The maximum amount per person will be determined by the Committee each year based on budget considerations and the location of the convention.
- 2) Convention registration fees, travel and room expenses but not board will be paid for any **active** PVMSC member going to convention as a voting delegate in another capacity (for example as a National Committee Chairman, National Officer, Zone Chairman or Delegate at Large). The amounts paid will be supplementary to funding from other sources and determined by the Committee each year based on budget considerations.
- 3) Convention registration fees will be paid for **active** PVMSC members who wish to go to convention as non-voting delegates.
- 4) The Committee may disburse any remaining funds to convention delegates (voting and non-voting) as it sees fit.

Delegates funded by PVMSC are required to give a convention report to the Board at the November meeting, file a full set of committee reports with the Secretary and write an article for the PVMSC newsletter.

## LEGISLATION CONSIDERATIONS

### ONE-EVENT REGISTRATION

**The following was excerpted from the report of the Ad Hoc One-Event Registration Committee report submitted at the 1992 USMS Convention.**

The concept of one-event registration is a very new consideration to USMS surfacing in 1991 at convention. When put to the House of Delegates it was initially defeated but it was agreed that it would be brought back before the House of Delegates after committee work had been conducted on the topic. The concept is not new to other sports federations in particular TriFed and NORBA whose pricing breakdown is shown:

TriFed: 30,000 one-event registrants 1991 (regular member \$25 — one-event member \$5)

NORBA: 25,000 one-event registrants 1991 in beginner category (regular member \$25 — one-event member \$5)

Many reasons have been given for considering one-event registration for USMS. One of the instigating considerations from the parties that first brought it to the floor was that of using it as a marketing tool to increase exposure and membership growth. After considerable discussion and research, the committee's decision by a vote of 4 to 2 was to recommend to the House of Delegates that they approve one-event registration with some reservations. Note: These reservations were in the convention packet which I did not keep.

In addition to these reservations, the following suggestions were brought up as additions to the original concept for consideration in today's discussion: 1) Since needs and wants vary between LMSCs, it was decided that one-event registration would remain optional among LMSCs; 2) One-event participants would register as unattached with an option to upgrade to full USMS registration with club affiliation within a reasonable time frame (30-60 days); 3) One-event registration would only be available to those participants who have never been registered with USMS. It was conceded that monitoring this policy would be difficult; 4) A separate data base would be set up to register; 5) Follow-up communication would be developed and distributed on a national level; 6) A national one-event registration fee of \$8 (\$5 for insurance, \$1 for registration, \$2 for communication) would be established to which each LMSC could tack on their own fee if necessary. Final communication fees would be dependent upon coordination with the Marketing Committee; 7) One-event registration would not be counted toward delegate status.

The committee's final decision is to recommend approval of one-event registration to the House of Delegates. A simple majority vote in favor of this recommendation directs the committee that there is sufficient interest in one-event registration to return to convention in 1993 with the plan completed and ready to implement following revisions etc. that would occur at that convention. It would appear as a legislative change proposal. A vote opposing one-event registration concludes the study...

**Note: The vote was favorable and the committee will report to the 1993 convention with implementation suggestions in September, 1993.**

### SUGGESTED LEGISLATION CHANGES

pg. 78 rule 503.1.4 — Membership in the House of Delegates. Change the rule to read:

All members of the Rules, and Legislation, and Long Distance Committees, the Controller, and the Chairmen of all standing committees appointed by the President shall be at-large members, if not already members.

Rationale: The members of the Rules and Legislation Committees are at-large members because these committees propose rules and legislation changes. Making them at-large members insures their presence at convention. Since the Long Distance Committee also proposes rules changes, its members should be at-large members as well.

The recently reactivated Potomac Valley Masters Swimming Awards Committee will begin presentation of the following awards for the 1993 swimming season:

1) Competitive Swimmer of the Year Awards – Awards to be presented to the male and female PVMS swimmer with the greatest number of national Top Ten times for each season (short course yards, short course meters, and long course meters). Awards will be determined upon receipt of the national rankings for each season.

2) Masters Swimmer of the Year Awards – Awards to be presented to the male and female PVMS swimmer who best exemplify the spirit of Master's swimming. Each PVMS team, through their Team Representative, may submit a nomination of one male and one female swimmer to the Awards Committee Chair by the time of the PVMSC Annual Meeting. Nominations of swimmers should include a statement supporting their qualifications for swimmer of the year. The nominated swimmer should be one who contributed to master's swimming through helping at meets or volunteering their services in other ways, trained consistently with your team, attended meets, and/or showed personal improvements in their swimming. All teams are encouraged to nominate deserving swimmers.
